Federal Adoption Tax Credit 2017 \$13,570 (Currently you can claim the credit on your federal tax return for the year in which your child’s adoption becomes final. This is an important financial benefit because it is a dollar-for-dollar reduction in your tax liability. For more information, see the IRS website or consult with your tax preparer.)	
State Adoption Tax Credit (Check with your tax preparer for deductions you may be eligible for within your state of residence. Contact your state’s Department of Revenue or Taxation or your State Adoption Specialist for more information.) (Not available in Utah)	
Employer/Military Adoption Benefits (Find out if your employer offers adoption benefits by contacting your Human Resources Department. Advocating for Adoption Benefits – If your company does not offer adoption benefits, you might consider proposing them.
